

TERI's Higher Education Information Center Celebrates 20 Years of Promoting College Access

Twenty years ago, the Higher Education Information Center (HEIC) opened its doors at the Boston Public Library. Since that day, TERI's HEIC has been dedicated to providing the encouragement, information, and practical help that empowers individuals to enrich their lives by going to college. Education advisors have assisted more than one million students

and adults with one-on-one counseling to make college access easier, more convenient, and less intimidating.

Since the opening of the first college access center, TERI has opened additional centers in convenient locations throughout Boston and surrounding communities. Early awareness and academic support programs are also

available at middle and high schools to help students prepare for and succeed in college and careers. These activities are geared specifically towards young people who, without proper guidance and encouragement, are unlikely to enroll in college or other career-building programs, but who have the potential to succeed in higher education.

Unveiling HEIC's New Name

During the 20th Anniversary celebration, Ann Coles, TERI Senior Vice President and the first Executive Director of the Higher Education Information Center (HEIC) and

Arturo Iriarte, current HEIC Executive Director and Vice President of TERI College Access, unveiled a new and very important direction for the organization.

HEIC, along with TERI's other college access programs,

will now be known as **TERI College Access**.

This change reflects TERI's growth into a multifaceted provider of comprehensive college access resources. It also communicates that the centers and other college access programs are an integral part of TERI's mission—to promote educational opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds.

Walk for Scholarship

For the second year, TERI was a major sponsor of Easy Freedom Walk for Scholarship America. TERI staff, as well as colleagues at First Marblehead, the Nellie Mae Education Foundation, and Boston Scientific took a 5K walk around Lake Quannapouit in Wakefield, MA. Over \$2,500 was raised for the Peter Medoff Dudley Street Neighborhood Initiative Scholarship, which provides scholarships for youth residing in the Dudley Street Neighborhood of Boston.

To celebrate the Higher Education Information Center's 20th Anniversary as a pioneer in the field of college access and to recognize the support and collaboration of its college access partners, TERI hosted a reception at the historic Boston Public Library in Copley Square. On October 15th – Get Ready for College Day – TERI College Access celebrated its 20th Anniversary with the students of ALL Boston public middle schools – 3,800 students in 22 schools!

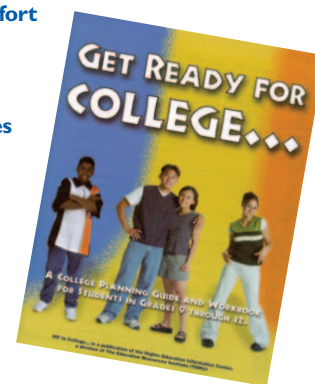

Classroom by classroom, talented teams of TERI College Access advisors, as well as staff and students from local colleges and universities, conducted programs and discussions to raise awareness of college opportunities. Students in 7th and 8th grade received a wealth of information on the importance and feasibility of going to college, as well as how to successfully plan and prepare for future opportunities.

TERI College Access distributed 5,000 Frisbees™ to the students (after school!) as a gift and reminder of the resources available to them in the community. It was a fun-filled day that brought young students a few steps closer to realizing their dream of a college education.

In addition to the middle school program initiative, TERI College Access partnered with the Boston Public Schools to provide college planning information. For the first time, the Boston Public Schools underwrote the cost of all 10th graders taking the PSATs. TERI College Access supplemented this effort by providing these students with free copies of its “Get Ready for College” planning guide.
